On August 1, Bravo School of Art opened its doors at the recently restored historic Barracks 19 Art & Design Center in NTC Promenade at Liberty Station.

The school offers 1-day workshops in art for adults and children. Workshops are taught by experienced working artists and include Mosaic, Decorative Art, Photography, Mixed Media, Fine Art, Jewelry Making, Printmaking and more. The school offers classes for children on Saturdays with workshops in drawing basics, crafts, color theory, clay, and other mediums. For the class schedule, go to the web site below.

The school also offers private custom workshops for groups of four or more.
